SUPERVISED STUDY RULES & REGULATIONS

Please read carefully as these are *strictly* adhered to.

1. **PUNCTUALITY:** Students must be present in the study room **at least 5 minutes before each session**. Students are not allowed to enter the study hall once a study period has commenced but may enter or leave study during the breaks. All late students will be asked to leave the premises by the supervisor.
2. Pupils are not allowed to use mobile phones, laptops i-pads, headphones etc. during study. **Mobile Phones must be switched off & left in school bag during study. No exceptions will be made.**
3. Chewing gum or crisps are not allowed in the building.
4. Any student considered to be interrupting or interfering in any way with any study session will be asked to leave the study room. Any student who is removed from study for any reason may not be allowed back into supervised study in the future.
5. Students are solely responsible for all of their personal belongings. Déise College will not accept responsibility for damage to/loss of such belongings. Due to COVID-19, storage of books is not permitted in any study hall, books must be removed at the end of every day unless the student is on the full weekly package (Mon.—Sat., limited availability of these seats).
6. Please use your own belongings. Due to COVID—19 it is prohibited to borrow pens or any objects. Students are not permitted to pass notes, books or any materials to another student during the study period.
7. Each student is responsible for their own area in the study room; in particular for tidiness of their area.
8. To ensure an effective study environment students must sit in the seat allocated to them and they are not allowed to leave their desk during a study session.
9. Students must maintain the required social distance during study breaks and take personal responsibility for themselves and others. Gatherings are not permitted.
10. Physical contact of any kind is prohibited.
11. All students must sanitise their hands when entering and exiting our premises. These sanitation stations are conveniently located in the building at entry and exit points.
12. We have implemented a one-way system (where possible) throughout the building, so please leave by the designated staircase from your study room.
13. Face masks are to be worn as recommended by government guidelines
14. Any student or member of staff who show any signs of Covid-19 must inform Déise College immediately and self-isolate at home. Students will be escorted to an isolation room, where parent/family are contacted in line with government guidelines.
15. The College should be advised of any relevant medical conditions by detailing them on the bottom margin of the application form.
16. Déise College is not responsible for students who leave the premises for whatever reason.

Grinds (one hour in duration) will run on a **weekly** basis costing **€20** per grind. A deposit of **€60** per subject is required to secure a place in a grind. This deposit will be offset against the **last three weeks** of the grind at the end of the school year.

The College provides grinds in a wide variety of subjects from first to sixth years (please see time table). We provide tuition for 5th and 6th class in Maths and Irish to prepare them for Secondary level.

The teaching is of the highest calibre. All teachers have been hand picked for their vast teaching experience and their **ability to get the best out of students**. To this end, if a teacher feels that a student is not working to the best of their abilities, that student's parents will be contacted and if there isn't an improvement in that student's work ethic, then that student will be asked to leave the grind permanently. We feel that this is only fair to the parents, as some students think that a grind will solve all their problems in a particular subject but sometimes they forget that **they** have to do the work, not the teacher giving the grind. To this end, all homework assigned by the teacher must be completed to the best of their ability; all relevant materials must be brought to each class and students must be in attendance punctually.

If a student is missing for any reason, then he/she will have to pay for two weeks the following week. The deposit cannot be used to pay for the week missed as all student records must be kept up to date. The teacher will, however, inform the student as to what he/she covered in the grind. All deposits are used to cover the last three grinds at the end of the school year.

The College has a **policy of not giving credit**, and to this end, all grinds must be paid for to the teacher at the grind. It is also possible for a student to pay for a number of grinds in advance; again payment for this should be made to the teacher at the grind.

Should you decide that your son/daughter, for whatever reason, is unable to continue to attend a grind, **four weeks notice in writing must be handed to the grind teacher. The student must pay for the grind on the week that this notice is handed in and the deposit can then be offset against the following three weeks.** Conversely, if the number of students attending a grind drops below three the College reserves the right to give the remaining students four weeks notice to subsequently finish the grind.

On a rare occasion, a teacher may be unable to attend the grind due to circumstances outside their control (e.g. parent/teacher meeting in their school). In these cases, we will endeavour to inform you well in advance of any change in time or date of grind and the change will be made in consultation with pupils if this is possible. Please note that photos and video footage may be taken for promotional reasons.

ATTENDANCE

To facilitate the smooth running of study and to allow parent/guardian to monitor their son/daughter's attendance at study a roll is taken during **each** study session.

It is vital that students sit in their assigned seat or they may be marked absent.

We strongly welcome and recommend that parents/guardians call into the Reception during office hours to see a student's attendance record, as from past experience, we have noticed that this motivates students more to attend and absenteeism rates amongst these students are a lot lower.

The College will not be responsible for students not presenting themselves for study and will not make contact with home re absenteeism.

In the event of a confirmed COVID-19 case, Déise College will have a log of students who were in the study room with the confirmed case in order to help with contact tracing.

From past experience, we strongly recommend that a student remains in supervised study until the end of the school year. This, in conjunction with the rules as outlined, are vital for the creation and maintenance of an effective study environment for your child. If a student, for whatever reason, is unable to continue with supervised study, **four weeks notice in writing** is required for evening study (six weeks for Saturday study). The deposit can then be offset against the following four weeks (six weeks for Saturday study).

Places are limited and it is advisable to complete the relevant form and return it with the **required deposit** to the College if your son/daughter is interested in participating in supervised study at the College.

CREDIT/PAYMENT POLICY IN RELATION TO SUPERVISED STUDY

The College has a **policy of not giving credit** and to this end all supervised study must be paid for at reception before study commences each week/Saturday. It is also possible to pay for a number of weeks/Saturdays or a term of supervised study in advance; again payment for this should be made at reception. In relation to evening study, **if a student is present on Monday and does not pay they will owe an extra euro on Tuesday and an extra euro for each day thereafter.** This policy has been implemented successfully in the past and it ensures that students do not forget their money.

If your son/daughter is missing from study for a week/Saturday for **any** reason, they will owe for two weeks/Saturdays the following week/Saturday, as their seat is allocated to them for the year and we guarantee that nobody else can take their place. **The deposit cannot be used to pay for the week missed as all student records must be kept up to date.**
